### **2023-2024 STUDENT ENROLLMENT**

Online registration for Student Enrollment for the 2022-2023 opened on **JANUARY 30, 2023** @ 7am.

Applications must be submitted for kindergarten, new students, and schools of choice. A school of choice is a school other than your catchment and/or feeder school. South Kelowna Elementary is a feeder school for KLO Middle School.

\*YOU DO NOT NEED TO REGISTER IF YOUR CHILD IS ALREADY ATTENDING S.K.E. or if they will be in Grade 7 this upcoming year and you wish for them to attend KLO Middle School\*\*

Please note that to qualify for kindergarten for the 2023-2024 school year, a child must reach the age of five prior to December 31, 2023.

Applications are assigned a date-time stamp and accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis in accordance with school district student placement policy 405R. Please complete the application as early as possible, and provide required documentation to the school ASAP. An application is only considered complete once all required registration documents have been successfully received by your first choice school.

### \*\*IMPORTANT SCHOOL PARKING SAFETY REMINDERS\*\*

South Kelowna families are very fortunate to have options for dropping off and picking up their children at school.



The S.K.E. staff has increased in previous years and many start their shifts at 8:30 a.m. As well, we have many itinerant staff members arriving throughout the day. As such, **the parking lot is for STAFF ONLY.** 

### We appreciate you respecting the following expectations:

- Please use the paved pathways and crosswalks at all times. Do not cut through the parking lot and bus lane.
- To ensure safety of all vehicles entering and exiting the school grounds, please obey ALL NO
   PARKING signs. Busses require clearance to enter and exit safely.
- <u>Please do not park or block our neighbours' driveways.</u> They need access to entering and leaving at all times.
- Drop off see below:

<u>Spiers Road</u>: \*\* <u>BEST OPTION</u> \*\* If dropping off on the school side (West), please be sure child(ren) exit the right-hand side of the vehicle directly onto the sidewalk. Please follow signage—do not park past the tall cedars as it makes it very difficult for busses to exit. If dropping off on the far side of the road (East), please park your car and <u>escort your child(ren) across the road</u>.

<u>Bus Loop</u>: \*DROP OFF ONLY AFTER 8:10 a.m.\* You may use the bus loop to drop off after the busses have left <u>after 8:10 a.m.</u>. If dropping off in the bus loop, please be sure your child(ren) exit the right-hand side of the vehicle directly onto the sidewalk. This avoids children going around vehicles and being in the line of passing cars. <u>Do not leave your vehicle</u> while utilizing the bus loop.

**Staff Parking Lot:** The parking lot is for **STAFF only.**

#### **HOW TO APPLY**

PLEASE NOTE: The application process is online only. You are required to have a valid email account.

In your web browser type: https://enrollment.sd23.bc.ca

No internet access? Please contact your school for assistance.

Online applications begin on Monday, January 30, 2023 at 7:00 am. Applications will be assigned a datetime stamp on a first-come, first-served basis, which will factor into a student's placement priority.

Complete the online application as early as possible, and provide the required documents listed below directly to the school by email by Friday, March 17, 2023.

- Student's Birth Certificate or other government issued proof of age and citizenship.
- 2. Proof of Parent/Guardian B.C. Residency
  - Combination BC Driver's License and Services Card (copy of both sides); or,
  - BC Services Card (copy of both sides) and one item from the list of supporting documentation below; or,
  - c. Proof of application for BC Medical Services Plan and one item from the list of supporting documentation below.
- 3. Proof of Parent/Guardian Living Address/Supporting Documentation
  - Ownership of a dwelling or long-term lease or rental of a dwelling;
  - Documentation indicating British Columbia residence (i.e. utility bill);
  - British Columbia registration of an automobile;
  - British Columbia Driver's License (copy of both sides); or,
  - · A current income tax return filed as a British Columbia resident.

#### AFTER Thursday, August 31, 2023

New in-catchment area enrollments: Parents will receive a confirmation email when the school has accepted the student's application for enrollment. Board Policy 405R – Student Placement (Regulations), will be used to determine student placement and priority.

**New out-of-catchment area enrollments:** Parents <u>may not</u> be notified until after the summer enrollment period is over and all in-catchment area students have been placed.

Qualifying age: The School Act requires that a child must be five years of age by December 31, 2023, to qualify for school enrollment in September 2023. No exceptions.
