2. Canadian Home and School Federation National Teacher/Staff Appreciation Week

The Central Okanagan Board of Education declared the week of February 8 to 12, 2021 as the Canadian Home and School Federation National Teacher/Staff Appreciation Week in Central Okanagan Public Schools.

The Canadian Home and School Federation (CHSF) is a national organization representing provincial parent associations, and is the only organization linking provincial parent groups across Canada on

issues of common national interest in public education. The Canadian Home and School Federation initiated the Teacher/Staff Appreciation Week (TSAW) in 1988. The purpose of this week is to encourage parents and the wider community to recognize the personal and professional contributions that our teachers and school staff make to children and their education.
