Action Items:

1. **2022-2023 and 2023-2024 Budget Timeline and Budget Development Principles**

The Board of Education approved the 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 Budget Timeline.

2. **Enrollment Application Dates for 2023/2024 School Year**

The Board of Education approved the initial enrollment application dates for the 2023/2024 school year be set as January 30, 2023 at 7:00 am through to March 17, 2023. The closing date of enrollment applications, in order to apply the Board's enrollment application priorities as established in Regulation 405R – Student Placement (Regulations), was set as August 31, 2023.

3. **Jordan's Principle Resolutions to Release Funding**

Jordan's Principle ensures all Indigenous children living in Canada can access the products, services and supports they need, when they need them, and continues to work closely with Provinces, Territories, Indigenous partners and service organizations to accomplish this goal. The available funding assists with a wide range of health, social, and educational needs for Indigenous students. Since 2016, the government has committed \$2.36 billion toward meeting the needs of Indigenous children through Jordan's Principle.

The Board of Education approved the allocation and direct deposit of funding from Indigenous Services Canada (ISC) to School District No. 23 (Central Okanagan) at 1040 Hollywood Road S, Kelowna, British Columbia, V1X 4N2, through banking services at:

The Board of Education further approved Delta Carmichael, Secretary-Treasurer/CFO, to sign the Indigenous Services Canada (ISC) Master Funding Agreement and amendments on behalf of The Board of Education of School District No. 23 (Central Okanagan) for the Fiscal Year 2022-2023.

4. **K-12 French Immersion in Lake Country**

The Board of Education agreed to establish a French Immersion program at George Elliot Secondary School effective the start of the 2023-2024 school year.

5. **Property Bylaw No. 158 – Fortis BC Statutory Right-of-Way on Anne McClymont Primary School Site**

The Board of Education gave first, second and third readings, and granted approval for registration of a Statutory Right-of-Way in favour of Fortis BC on Parcel A (DD 136162F and Plan B6398) of Lot 2 District Lot 167 Osoyoos Division Yale District Plan 2703, Except Plan EPP49185, known as Anne McClymont Primary School.

6. **Appointment of Trustee Representatives to the District Indigenous Education Council**

The Board of Education appointed Trustee Desrosiers and Trustee Fraser as the trustee representatives, and Trustee Tiede as the alternate, to the District Indigenous Education Council.

All Students	96%
Indigenous Students	86%
Students with Designations:	79%
