INFORMATION ITEMS

Superintendent's Emergent Issues

The Superintendent of Schools/CEO advised there were no emergent issues to report.

Revenue and Expense Summary as at October 31, 2016

Trustee Mossman, Chair of the Finance and Legal Committee, provided an overview of the discussion that took place at the November 23, 2016 Committee Meeting. Assistant Secretary-Treasurer, Eileen Sadlowski, briefly outlined the Summary.

<u>Central Okanagan Budget – Compare Report</u>

The Assistant Secretary-Treasurer provided an overview of the report and noted that increased enrolment grants together with operating carry-forwards (which were predicted to be \$3.2 million) are actually \$4.2 million. The Student FTE summary was also reviewed wherein it was noted that total enrolment is 348.25 over projection for the current school year and 458.38 over last year.

Update on Refugees within the Central Okanagan Public Schools

Trustee Mossman, Chair of the Finance and Legal Committee, outlined the information discussed at the November 23, 2016 Committee Meeting. He advised a report had been requested from staff showing a broader picture of the number of refugee students and the work done by the District's Settlement Workers in Schools (SWIS). The Superintendent of Schools/CEO advised it is expected another 1,500 refugees will be settled in British Columbia in the near future and eight new students are expected in Central Okanagan Public Schools before the end of the year.

Statement of Financial Information for the Year Ending June 30, 2016

Trustee Mossman, Chair of the Finance and Legal Committee, advised this report was reviewed at the November 23, 2016 Committee Meeting. The entire document has been posted to the District's website.

Video Surveillance: Annual Report to the board

The Secretary-Treasurer noted this annual report is a requirement under the School Act. There have been very few changes since last year regarding use of video surveillance and it continues to be utilized to focus on staff and student safety. The Superintendent of Schools/CEO advised the District continues to work with the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Commissioner to ensure all policies and practices meet FOIPOP regulations.

The Secretary-Treasurer advised the Ministry of the Environment has recognized the District for its Carbon Neutral Government Program. Energy and Sustainability Manager, Harold Schock, noted the Premier's Award is a result of the efforts of staff and senior administration in reducing the carbon footprint of the District's facilities.

<u>Sara Neukomm</u>, a parent of students attending Rose Valley Elementary, and Co-President of the school's Parent Advisory Committee, asked that the Board of Education defer its decision regarding French Immersion at Rose Valley Elementary (RVE). The RVE parents and community have not been consulted and the impact on the school, its students and staff, is unknown and may be significant.

<u>Shelley Courtney</u>, COPAC President, thanked the Board of Education and District staff for the time and effort put into the French Immersion process. She noted parents as a whole did have a great deal of input during the consultation process which is appreciated.

TRUSTEES QUERIES/COMMENTS

Trustee Fraser

Commented that at both WE Day and the Learning Forward Conference, information was shared regarding gathering information in order to create a Strategic Plan and asked if the Board would be proceeding with a Strategic Plan in the near future.

The Board Chair advised this is a topic which will be discussed at a future meeting with Board and District Staff.

ACTION ITEMS

French Immersion Review

The Superintendent of Schools/CEO reviewed his report and highlighted the key discussion points that had taken place over the past two years as well as the significant background resulting in the recommendations before the Board.

The Board discussed the Review in depth. Points of consideration included the results of the online survey, student cohorts, the Dr. Knox and Springvalley Middle Options, middle and late French Immersion programs, and single track French Immersion schools. The impact of the Westside Project Identification Report (PIR), which is currently in the process of being completed, will come before the Board in early 2017; however, the PIR will affect how grades 9 to 12 are housed.

Assistant Superintendent, Rhonda Ovelson, provided further information regarding the French Immersion Task Force's work over the past few years as well as the findings which included late immersion and creating cohorts now in order to sustain the later immersion enrolment.
