## 1. Suspension Summary Report: 2009/2010 – 2014/2015

The highlights of the Suspension Summary Report includes the decline in the number of indefinite suspensions from 15 in 2013-2014 to 3 in 2014-2015. This is an indicator of continued utilization of positive proactive approaches to dealing with students who are presenting challenging behaviours and the relative appropriateness of interventions that have been developed and implemented for students over the past number of years. Although the decrease in definite suspensions from 1106 in 2013-2014 to 1000 in 2014-2015 is positive and promising, it needs to be monitored.
