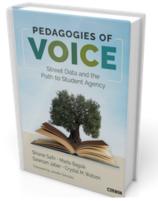

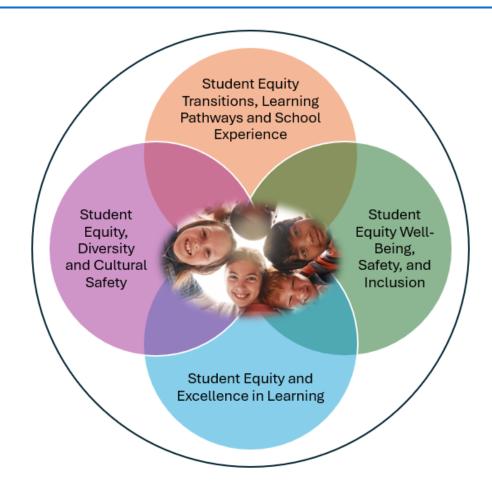

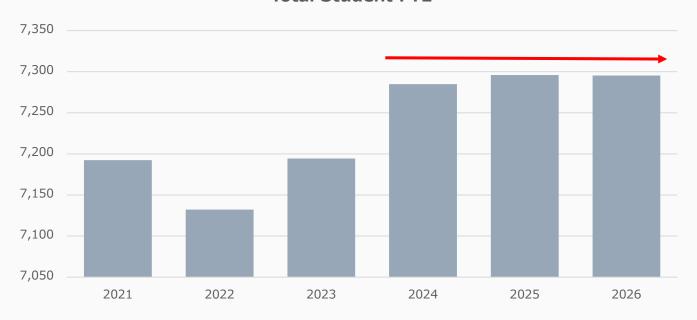


CENTRAL OKANAGAN PUBLIC SCHOOLS STUDENT ENROLLMENT TREND ANALYSIS

HISTORICAL ENROLMENT TRENDS



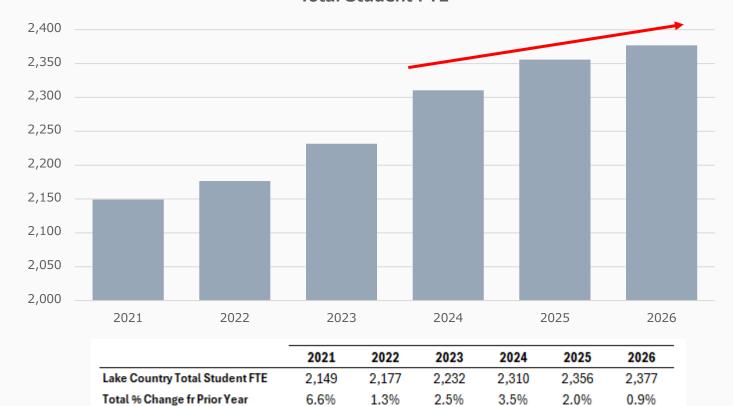

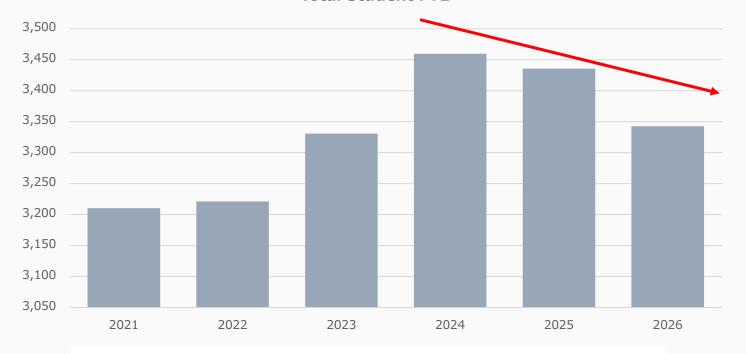

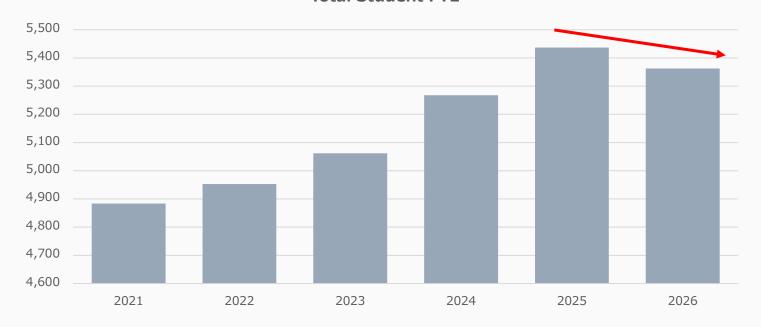
Mission Family of Schools Total Student FTE

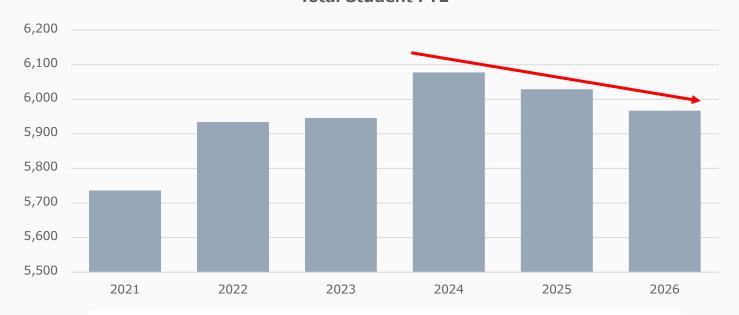
Rutland Family of Schools Total Student FTE

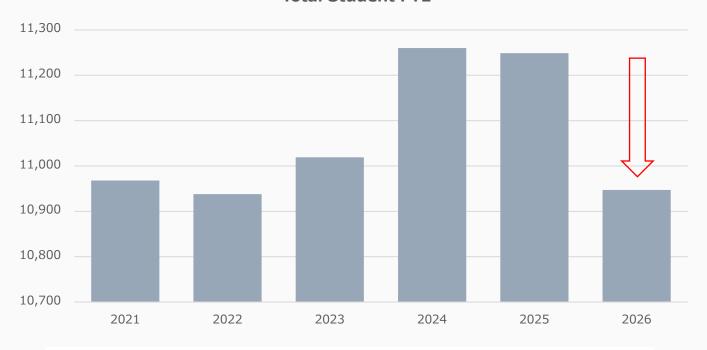
Westside Family of Schools Total Student FTE

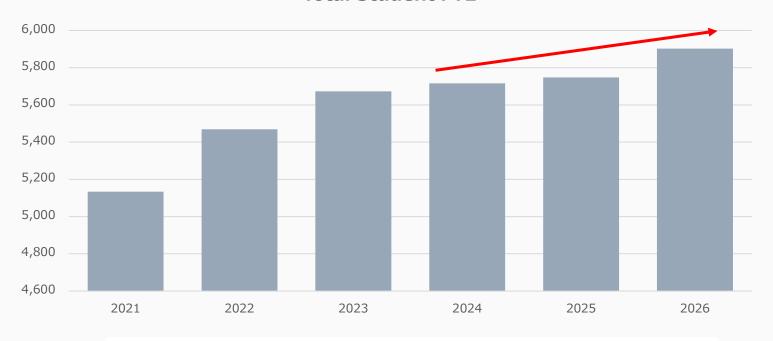
Elementary Schools Total Student FTE

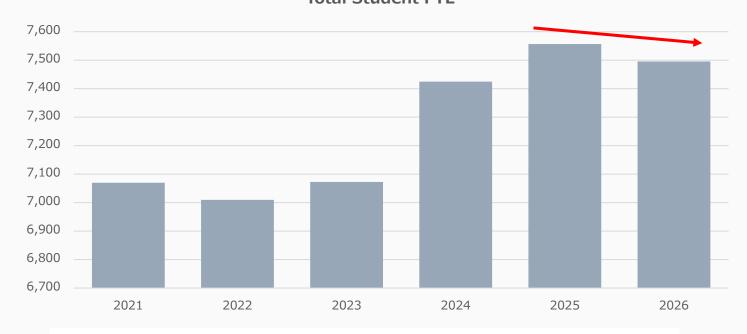
Middle Schools Total Student FTE

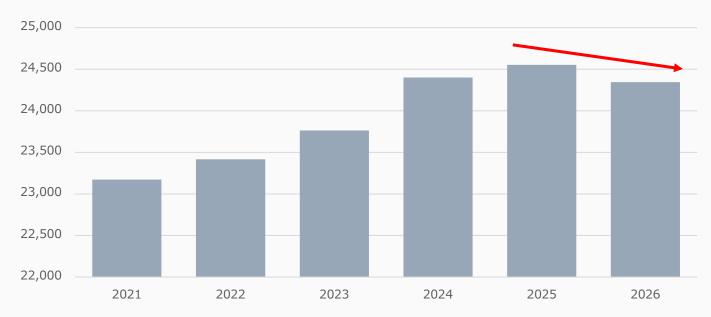
Secondary Schools Total Student FTE

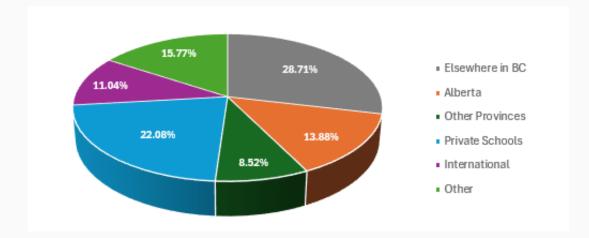

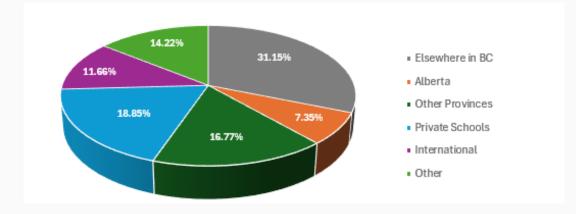

WHERE DID THEY GO?

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

- Student enrolment is directly related to the District's Operating grant funding
- As student FTE fluctuates, funding fluctuates.
- In the current year, student FTE is estimated to decrease by -0.8% from the prior year.
- The 2025/2026 student FTE enrolment projection of 150 student FTE did not come to fruition.
- Student enrollment will contract for the first time since 2015
- District operating budgets have been reduced by \$9M since Fall of 2024
- The 2025/2026 operating budget will be adjusted in response to the decline in enrollment

CONSIDERATIONS

- There are several economic pressures that put the District's budget at risk including illness, benefit costs, tariffs, cost escalation.
- The Ministry of Education and Child Care does not fund inflationary costs.
- 89% of the District's Operating Fund is people (wages and benefit costs).
- It is becoming increasingly more difficult to reduce operational services, supplies and capital budgets that account for only 11% of the budget.

NEXT STEPS

- District staff will continue to monitor student enrolment and will develop a plan to address the shortfall.
- An overview of the plan will be shared at the October 15, 2025
 Public Board Meeting.
