Making Our Voices Heard on a Global Stage: COP30 in Belém, Brazil

Carter highlighted how being a part of AP Passion to Action in collaboration with The Centre for Global Education and #Decarbonize enabled him and Liberty to go to Brazil to represent Canadian Youth at COP30 (The United Nations Climate Conference). Carter shared how they took on roles at the conference which included being the Head Global Reporter, interviewing youth, world leaders, and others at COP, being interviewed at a press junket, co-hosting a Live From COP event for elementary students across the world, presenting their ideas during live panels, and networking with people involved in Climate Action across the world, among others. Carter also shared which competencies he grew while in Brazil, how he has been forever changed by this experience, how the experience has impacted his thinking about his potential future, and why we should support future students in the Central Okanagan to take their learning to the global stage. Finally, Carter expressed what he and Liberty plan to do with their learning now that they have returned to Lake Country and how they hope to impact others around Climate Action.

1. 2025/2026 Amended Annual Budget Bylaw

The Board of Education gave first, second and third readings, and adopted School District No. 23 (Central Okanagan) Amended Annual Budget Bylaw for the Fiscal Year 2025/2026 in the amount of \$386,023,000.

2. Digital Platforms – School District No. 23 (Central Okanagan)

The Board of Education directed the Superintendent to ensure that the choice of digital platforms on which the District has an official account is restricted to those whose Policies align with District and Board values, and in particular those that are committed to protecting the privacy and security of children in content that appears on their platform.

9. 2026 Long-Range Facility Plan Review

Following Ministry of Education and Child Care Guidelines, the District requires a Long-Range Facility Plan (LRFP) to guide facility decisions in line with student enrollment, educational needs, and community growth. The LRFP supports capital requests through the annual Five-Year Capital Plan and must be regularly reviewed to stay relevant and aligned with strategic priorities. The District is conducting a full review of the LRFP, which was last updated in 2021, to ensure it accurately reflects current facility needs, educational programs, demographic trends, and community growth. The LRFP informs Ministry funding decisions and will now be updated every two years to maintain accuracy for the Five-Year Capital Plan process.

The Board Chair, Trustees and the Superintendent of Schools, spoke of the following:

- Attendance at various meetings and events throughout the District, including the 2026 Gateway Graduation (a partnership between Okanagan College and Central Okanagan Public Schools), the Strategic Plan Public Engagement Sessions and school visits with the Superintendent of Schools.
- The public presentation explaining how the District's budget is established will take place at the Central Okanagan Parent Advisory Council (COPAC) meeting on Monday, February 2, 2026, at 6:30 pm by Zoom. - The Primary Winter Gathering, a cultural event, has been taking place at the Learning Centre over the past 3 days, involving over 300 Indigenous students.

The closing date of enrollment applications, to apply the Board's enrollment priorities as established in *Regulations 405R – Student Placement (Regulations)*, is set as Thursday, September 3, 2026 at 3:30 pm.
