1. Student Voice in Designing Innovative Spaces – Raymer Elementary School

Principal Terrilynn Nunes described how the school community is using the 'spirals of inquiry' to codesign innovative learning spaces. Simrat presented a video, describing how the focus on 'growth mindsets' help students learn more about thinking and learning and how learning space impacts learning. Malhyia spoke of how facility upgrades (removing the old lockers) provide new collaborative learning spaces. Students researched, ordered and tested the furniture to ensure the new furniture supported enriched learning opportunities. Dimitre described how the new collaborative space called the 'Raven's Nest' is used for collaborative and quiet learning. Resource teacher, Tatiana DeFaria, shared how the newly-designed spaced also provides an opportunity for students to learn about self-regulation. Students, Sarah and Caleb, also added that special lighting and collaborative, innovative learning spaces in classrooms enable students to choose their learning space, personalizing the way in which students are learning in classrooms. Teacher Jodi Lightfoot also described how staff worked in teams to beautify areas of Raymer Elementary School. Next steps? Students will be using 'Applied Design Skills and Technology (ADST)' to beautify and create innovative learning spaces outside of the school.
