Quest BC is a pilot program offered in the first semester to Grade 11 students at Okanagan Mission Secondary School. Twenty-four students work with two teachers (Mr. Ross and Mrs. Marrs). Learning journeys will include visits to the Rockies, Tofino, UVIC, Vancouver, UBC, Whistler, Revelstoke and areas throughout the Central Okanagan. Learning is expressed in many ways, including: essays, documentaries, multimedia presentations, vlogs, digital portfolios and campfire discussions. Upon the completion of the semester, students receive 28 course credits towards graduation. Lauren and Yvonne spoke about their learning and excitement by experiencing the outdoors first hand.

The Board of Education made the following decision regarding grade 4 middle entry French Immersion on the Westside:

- A Grade 4 middle entry French Immersion program be opened at Hudson Road Elementary School in September 2019.
- That students registered in the French Immersion program, within that school, transition to Glenrosa Middle School for grade 6 in 2021.
- A consultation meeting with the school community be scheduled so that an implementation plan can be developed with staff, student and parent input.
- Students in the first cohort of early entry French Immersion students will transition from École George Pringle Elementary School to Glenrosa Middle School for grade 6 in 2019.
