## **MENTORS**


- Recognized as key contributors to student success and CARE project quality

- Share knowledge and context to support project research and development
- Time commitment 1-2 hours

- Connect with classroom teachers and students as an in-person or virtual guest presenter
- Time commitment 1-2 hours
