BOARD OF EDUCATION BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

1. RCMP School Resource Officers

Al Lalonde, District Principal of Learning Support Services, described the role of the RCMP School Resource Officers who provide support to our schools, students, and families in each of our four municipalities. Constable Robyn Boffy defined her position as "helping students become awesome adults". Constable Boffy also shared the proactive nature of building relationships with school communities. Constable Sherri Lund provided a further description of the ways each officer becomes intertwined with the fabric of the school community, learning deeply how best to support each unique cohort of students. One example of influence was the implementation of the Preventing Alcohol and Risk-Related Trauma in Youth (P.A.R.T.Y.) Program to help students understand the grave consequences of engaging in risky behaviours.

The Board of Education recognized Constable Robyn Boffy, Constable Georgina Josefsson, Constable Sherri Lund, Constable Brandwyn Rigby and Constable Erin Willcocks for their exemplary work in our schools during their tenure as Resource Officers.

The Board of Education approved grade 9 and grade 10 student participation in the McCreary Centre Society 'Foundry Baseline Study' on adolescent access to mental health services.

Information Items:

Superintendent's Emergent Issues:

- The Superintendent discussed the Emergency Operations Evacuation Alert and potential flooding at George Elliott Secondary School. The high riverbanks of Vernon Creek are being monitored as this poses a threat of flooding and is considered a safety hazard for the community. Emergency Plans, including sandbagging riverbanks, evacuation plans, relocating students, and possible staging areas, have been set in place. Emergency Plans have been communicated to the parents of George Elliot Secondary School.
- Some of the bus runs on the Westside have been rerouted to include alternate bus stops due to current flooding.

 - The Superintendent recently distributed a letter to all Central Okanagan Public Schools' parents to ensure parents are aware and informed of the Netflix series '13 Reasons Why' about a young girl who dies by suicide and the message she leaves for 13 people she feels are responsible for her pain. The show is targeted for students sixteen years of age or older.
