# BOARD OF EDUCATION BOARD MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

The Central Okanagan Board of Education acknowledged that this meeting was held on the Traditional Territory of the Okanagan People.

#### Introduction:

1. The Board of Education introduced and congratulated **Leanne Zorn** on her new assignment as **District Principal – Human Resources**.

The Assistant Secretary-Treasurer introduced staff from Purchasing and Central Stores as 'unsung heroes' of the School District for all of their efforts to support the schools and business offices through purchasing and distribution of learning resources, furniture, and paper, office, and school supplies. The staff also distributes the internal school mail, manages hazard waste removal, and disposal of outdated resources/furnishings. The Acting President of CUPE also commended the Central Stores staff for exemplary service to the District.

#### Recognition:

1. Alida Privett, Principal, Mar Jok Elementary School Recipient of Canada's Outstanding Principals Award

The Board of Education acknowledged Alida Privett for her national recognition as one of Canada's Outstanding Principals by the Learning Partnership. The Learning Partnership's Outstanding Principals program recognizes the unique and vital contribution of principals in publicly funded schools. The 40 principals nominated by parents, colleagues and community members, and chosen

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by a national selection committee, are being celebrated for demonstrating innovation, leadership and for employing creativity in finding solutions and opportunities within their school communities.

# 2. Mike Sodaro, Teacher, KLO Middle School B.C.'s Volleyball Coach of the Year

Mike Sodaro was acknowledged by the Board of Education for being named B.C.'s Volleyball Coach of the Year. This award recognizes individuals who have made a noteworthy contribution to high school volleyball. Mr. Sodaro has coached at the senior level at KSS and also at Mount Boucherie Secondary School. Not only has Mr. Sodaro supported high school volleyball, he has also been involved and supported volleyball club programs in our community.

#### 3. Moyra Baxter, Chairperson - Central Okanagan Public Schools

Secretary-Treasurer, Larry Paul, recognized the Central Okanagan Public Schools' Board Chairperson, Moyra Baxter, for twenty years of public service as a School Trustee.

#### Action Items:

#### 1. Policy Review – Library Learning Commons

The Board of Education approved the amendments to Policy 460 – Appeals, Regulations 460.1R – Appeals, Form 460.1 – Request for Reconsideration of Learning Resource(s), Policy 535 – Instructional Resources and Library Resources and Regulations 535R – Instructional Resources and Library Resources. The amendments have been made to reflect the language in Policy 532 – Library Learning Commons.

#### 2. Amendments to Policy 515 – Family Life Education Program

The Board of Education approved the amendments to Policy 515 – Family Life Education Program, including the renaming of the Program and Policy to the Sexual Health Education Program.

#### 3. Core Funding for Aboriginal Education

A letter will be written to the Ministry of Education from the Board of Education outlining the need for the province to provide additional core funding for Aboriginal Education Program staff and learning resources to support the implementation of the redesigned curriculum.

### 4. Multiple Entry Points into French Immersion Program to Create Flexibility for Families

The Board of Education approved the following 2 Motions:

THAT: The Board of Education supports flexible entry points to the French Immersion Program across the District that are appropriate to the principles of inclusivity, accessibility and sustainability.

THAT: Further consultation occur with the community regarding the implementation of grade 4 middle entry French Immersion and/or grade 6 late entry French Immersion.

#### 5. Potential Impact of 2002 Restored Collective Agreement Language

The Board of Education agreed to write a letter to the Ministry of Education, outlining the budget pressures and space challenges that may result from the 2002 restored Collective Agreement language and request assurances that the Ministry will provide adequate, sustainable and predictable funding in order to continue to educate students in a safe and inspirational learning environment in Central Okanagan Public Schools.

#### 6. 2017-2018 School Calendar

The Board of Education adopted a Local School Calendar for the 2017-2018 school year as attached. The calendar will be made available to the District by February 28, 2017 and submitted to the Ministry of Education by March 31, 2017. The Superintendent will direct school Principals, in consultation with staff and parents, to establish a site-based calendar for the 2017-2018 school year.

In establishing such calendars, principals must:

- a. Conform to the School Act and Regulations, applicable Collective Agreements, and School District No. 23 (Central Okanagan) Board Policy.
- b. Schedule school parent/teacher conference times.
- c. Schedule their school's calendar and bell schedule.

#### 7. Student Learning Grant

The Board of Education approved the process for the distribution of the Student Learning Grant. This one-time Special Grant will flow to Districts by mid-March. Funds are intended to be spent on learning resources, supplies, and equipment to help ensure classrooms are well-resourced and students are well-supported through the implementation of the new curriculum and other learning innovations across the K-12 public education system. District by district allocations are not yet available, however an estimate of what the Central Okanagan Public Schools would receive based on the allocated method of \$50/FTE is \$1,104,000.
