#### Information Items:

# 1. Superintendent's Emergent Issues

Staff is beginning to review the Westside growth pressures which may or may not result in a grade reconfiguration. The Project Identification Report (PIR) process is in the beginning phase to determine patterns of growth and future space requirements in Westside schools. At this time, there is no plan to implement a grade reconfiguration on the Westside.

The Superintendent of Schools and the Chairperson of the Board recently toured the Minister of Education through Rutland Middle School to discuss the current facility challenges associated with the Rutland Middle School building.

# 2. May 31, 2016 \$25 Million in Redirected Administrative Savings for School Districts

The Central Okanagan School District will receive \$967,983.00 of redirected administrative savings for the 2016-2017 school year. The Board will determine, through consultation at the upcoming June 15, 2016 Public Finance and Legal Committee meeting and the June 22, 2016 Public Board meeting, how this additional funding will be allocated.

3. Ministry Response to Annual Capital Plan Submission (Non-Monetary Bylaw)

The Annual Capital Plan projects were reviewed by the Secretary Treasurer.

4. The Board of Education reviewed the Grant Thornton Report to the Finance and Legal Committee – Initial Communication on Audit Planning, School Fees 2016/2017, Financial Update – International Education Program, Trustee Travel Expenses, the Executive Members for COPVPA, COTA and COPAC partner groups, Field Trips 2015/2016 and the General Statement.
