School Psychologists

Al Lalonde, District Principal - Learning Support Services, introduced two of the Central Okanagan School District's School Psychologists, Nola Hedstrom-Beblow and Blair Murray. The School District currently employs 9 School Psychologists. Ms. Hedstrom-Beblow and Mr. Murray outlined their experience in the District and the requirements to become a School Psychologist. The role of the School Psychologist in schools was presented which includes:

- assessing students and determining if they meet Ministry of Education criteria for a learning disability or an intellectual disability
- making specific and appropriate data based recommendations for interventions to support a student's academic, cognitive and social emotional growth
- collaborating and consulting with families, administrators, School Based Teams, counsellors, doctors, other specialist teachers, classroom teachers, across multiple schools
