1. Funding Review Report

Presenter: Kevin Kaardal, Superintendent of Schools/CEO

In February 2018, the Minister of Education appointed a seven member Independent Funding Model Review Panel to review and provide recommendations to the way funding is allocated in the K-12 public education sector in British Columbia. The review and recommendations were informed by feedback received during one-on-one meetings with sector partners and stakeholders, regional meetings with or written submissions from all 60 school district leadership teams, and over 100 written submissions from a range of other stakeholder and partner organizations. Perspectives were also received from First Nations, partner groups, K-12 public education stakeholder organizations, as well as community organizations, individual parents and parent groups.

The presentation by the Superintendent of Schools/CEO outlined the 22 recommendations from the Independent Funding Model Review Panel. Further in-depth discussions on the recommendations will take place at future Finance and Audit Committee and Education and Student Services Committee Meetings. The Committees will then bring back to the Board their recommendations.
