The Hub's mandate is "Healthy Families – Healthy Kids". Their mission is "to increase awareness and accessibility to services that promote healthy development that foster resiliency and life-long learning, helping families connect to community". Hub services include information, support, and referrals for families. The Pearson Road Elementary School Family Hub welcomed 4000 people, throughout the Central Okanagan region, in the past year. Over 100 sessions last year also provided specific support to Aboriginal students and families.

1. Orange Shirt Day – Saturday, September 30, 2017

The Central Okanagan Board of Education declared Friday, September 29th, 2017 as "Orange Shirt Day" in Central Okanagan Public Schools. Orange Shirt Day recognizes and celebrates the resilience and bravery of residential school survivors and their families. Presentation:

1. School Opening Report – Part 2

The Superintendent of Schools/CEO presented the 2017 School Opening Report – Part 2. This report provides detailed information about school enrolment and covers the time period of September 9 through 22, 2017. To date, the District has enrolled 22, 502 students this year which is 259 students above last year. 1. Kelowna's Healthy City Strategy Partnership Invitation

The Board of Education referred the Kelowna's Healthy City Strategy Partnership Invitation to the Health Promoting Schools Committee for discussion and a recommendation back to the Board.

2. Audited Financial Statements Fiscal Year 2016/2017

The Board of Education received and approved the Audited Financial Statements Fiscal Year 2016/2017. It was noted that the auditors stated that "the financial statements of School District No. 23 (Central Okanagan) for the year ended June 30, 2017 are prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with the accounting requirements of Section 23.1 of the Budget Transparency and Accountability Act of the Province of British Columbia".

3. Rutland Middle School Project Development Report (PDR) – Update

The Board of Education approves that the Rutland Junior Middle School Project Development Report (PDR) for a 700 student capacity middle school for the amount of \$35,903,140 be submitted to the Ministry of Education.
