# 2. Recognition of Staff and Volunteers

## Information Items

## 1. Superintendent's 2012/2013 District Budget Recommendations

The Superintendent presented his Budget Recommendations for the 2012/2013 school year.

Every year the Ministry of Education announces next year's budget allocation to School Districts. For the 2012/2013 school year, the Ministry of Education will be providing a total of \$4.725 billion in operating grants to Boards of Education throughout the province. This compares to \$4.721 billion for the 2011/2012 school year. This increase in the Provincial Education Budget, as well as a

redistribution among funding categories, provides additional funding to address specific objectives established by the Ministry. The per pupil funding level of \$6,784 per School Age FTE (Full Time Equivalent) student remains the same for the 2012/2013 as it was for the 2011/2012 school year.

Within the Central Okanagan School District, provincial funding has resulted in an operating grant of \$174.1 million for 2012/2013. This represents a \$1.8 million increase in the preliminary Operating Grants over 2011/2012. This increase, combined with increases in locally generated funds, provides a \$2.7 million increase to operating revenue for the coming year.

The Superintendent's recommendations for the allocation of these resources, along with the anticipated surplus carry forward funds, will be deliberated at the April 18, 2012 Public Finance and Legal Committee meeting and at the April 25, 2012 Public Board meeting. Both meetings will be held at the School Board office.
