1. Innovative Learning Environments Projects

Jamie Robinson, District Principal for Leadership in Learning & Innovation, introduced the concept of the Innovative Learning Environments Projects, which are going on across the District in multiple schools and at all levels. The Innovative Learning Environments are founded on the '7 Principles of Learning' from the Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD).

Principal Jared Birkeland and Teachers Jennifer Moffatt and Heather Letkeman shared that two classrooms of elementary students at North Glenmore Elementary School are currently involved in the Innovative Learning Environment Project. The redesign of the classrooms coupled with the collaborative approach to implementing the redesigned curriculum is providing multiple learning environments to meet the individual educational needs of students.

Principal Trent Dolgopol and Teachers Kristi Langlois and Kevin Dent described École Dr. Knox Middle School's new Grade 8 Learning Community. Three teachers share sixty-eight students within three classrooms. The focus on project-based inquiry learning integrates several core and curricular competencies. The classrooms have also been redesigned to provide flexible and personalized learning environments.

A video was shared, showcasing students' testimonies related to their experiences. Students expressed the importance of having several adults support their learning as well as the opportunity to have 'voice and choice' in their learning while engaged in meaningful project-based inquiry.

1. Okanagan College Dual Credit Administrative Assistant and Office Assistant Programs In attendance:

Assistant Superintendent Vianne Kintzinger provided an overview of the Ministry of Education's Career Education curriculum, which enables students to discover a bridge between classroom learning and workplace and post-secondary opportunities. These opportunities support smooth transitions from secondary school to post-secondary education and the workplace. As part of the District's Career Education Program, Mrs. Kintzinger highlighted the importance of Dual Credit courses, enabling students to garner specific occupational skills while enrolled as a secondary student. Brenda Ridgeley-Ketchell, Okanagan College Chair – Office Administration, provided an overview of the Office Assistant Program and the Administrative Assistant Program currently being offered at Okanagan College for post-secondary students. Through a possible Dual-Credit partnership, secondary school students would have the opportunity to enrol in these courses. This potential partnership will be discussed at the December 13th, 2017 public Board meeting.
