The Board recognized Assistant Superintendent, Terry Beaudry, and all others involved in the creation of the "*Together We Learn*" insert issued by the Kelowna Capital News this week which will be provided to all 22,000 students. The Assistant Superintendent expressed appreciation to Donna Stathers, Principal of Glenrosa Elementary School; Michelle DesRochers, Executive Assistant and Karen Hill, Publisher of the Kelowna Capital News. 1. Canadian Union of Public Employees Local 3523 Newsletter

On a quarterly basis, CUPE Local 3523 prepares a Newsletter "CUPE Connection" for distribution to its members. Wendy Johnson, President of CUPE 3523 introduced Treena Harley, Secretary for CUPE 3523, who is responsible for the preparation of the quarterly Newsletter. CUPE Local 3523 was awarded the Provincial Communications Award at the 2015 CUPE National Convention for an innovative approach to communicating to members.

2. International Education Department

Dr. Rick Oliver, Director of Instruction K-12 introduced the video prepared by the International Education Department promoting the Central Okanagan School District. There are currently 800 new immigrant students from 61 countries, 400 international students and 370 English Language Learners attending Central Okanagan School District schools.

There are currently 2 Settlement Workers in Schools (SWIS), who provide support to all new immigrant families in the District. Donna Garbelya, a SWIS worker, introduced parent Lily Qin who shared her story and appreciation for the support she has received since relocating her family from China.

The Board of Education approved the adjustment of the catchment area for Lake Country to include the Woodsdale Road area to Oyama Traditional School and the Southwest Quadrant of Lake Country to Peter Greer Elementary School (not including the Sage Glenn subdivision).

Information Items:

1. Superintendent's Emergent Issues

- The BC Human Rights Tribunal recently approved a Hiring Exemption, enabling preferential hiring of applicants who self-identify as having Aboriginal ancestry for the new Family and Child Support Worker positions and the Clinical Supervisor position to support Aboriginal students in the Central Okanagan School District.
- A joint letter (written by Kevin Kaardal, Superintendent of Schools; Susan Bauhart, President of COTA, and Raquel Steen, President of COPVPA) was recently distributed to teachers, Principals and Vice-Principals outlining the focus of the upcoming February 9th Non-Instructional Day. This day will bring together 1500 educators to explore the redesigned BC curriculum and the K-12 learner competencies. A copy of the letter of invitation is attached.

The Board of Education agreed to write a letter to the Ministry of Education expressing their outrage that the differentiated compensation increase for Principals and Vice-Principals is to be funded by individual Districts, and not by the Province.

The Board Chairperson, Assistant Superintendent, and Westbank First Nation Councillor Chris Derickson (Chair of the District's Aboriginal Education Council) recently presented to the Okanagan Nation Alliance and Okanagan MLA Caucus to share the District's innovative programs and practises currently being implemented to support Aboriginal student achievement.

Teachers, Principals, Vice-Principals and Senior Educational Staff,

The Central Okanagan Teachers' Association (COTA), the Central Okanagan School District and the Central Okanagan Principals' and Vice-Principals' Association (COPVPA) are excited to invite all COTA members, Principals, Vice-Principals and senior educational staff to our February 9th District Non-Instructional Day which will focus on exploring the redesigned BC Curriculum. The Joint Education Change Committee (JECC) is working alongside 58 COTA facilitators to provide a multitude of sessions on a variety of topics specific to the redesigned curriculum, and the K-12 learner competencies.

Secondly, any experiences that demonstrate the journey towards more personalized learning for students, and most certainly the questions you require clarity around. Feel free to bring technology, examples or resources that you are willing to highlight or share with your colleagues to make everyone's journey easier. The facilitators will be utilizing the First Peoples Principles of Learning and the Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development Principles of Learning to help facilitate discussion.

Working towards the implementation of the redesigned curriculum may seem like a tremendous task for an individual teacher. However, "*Together We Learn*" is more than just a District statement, it is a truth ... that together we can learn and use reciprocal relationships to create safe, inclusive learning teams that share expertise, diverse understandings, and inquiry as we move forward in our understanding of the redesigned curriculum.

Part-time teachers are invited to attend and will be compensated if it is not in their regular schedule. Teachers Teaching on Call are also invited to attend; however, there is no budget for TTOCs to attend on a paid basis unless they are in a temporary contract and scheduled to work that day. Teacher candidates are also welcome to attend.

Other details and logistics will be provided in the near future including an agenda for the day and opportunity to preregister for the sessions.
