Central Okanagan Public Schools - "Inside 23"

1. Settlement Workers in Schools

Dr. Rick Oliver, Assistant Superintendent – Westside schools, introduced Donna Garbelya and Carol Davidson, two of the International Education Settlement Workers in Schools (SWIS) who both recently retired. Also introduced were Renate Lutz and Christine Neufeld who will be the new SWIS workers in the International Education Department. Central Okanagan Public Schools have had Settlement Workers in Schools since 2008. Dr. Oliver described the role of Settlement Workers in Schools (SWIS) who provide transitional support to students and families immigrating to the Central Okanagan from all over the world. Personalized settlement plans provide new families with support and services to help the families settle into their new school communities and the greater community. The Settlement Workers in Schools (SWIS) positions are funded through the Federal Government.

Action Items:

2. 2017/2018 CommunityLINK Allocations

The Board of Education approved the recommended School-Based CommunityLINK Allocations 2017/2018.

3. Ministry Early Learning Agreement Approval

The Board of Education approved the new Early Learning Agreement with the Ministry of Education.

4. Budget Recommendations

The Board of Education approved the following budget items:

- 1. the addition of two (2) full time equivalent (FTE) custodians (\$115,000) to the custodial staffing in order to continue to maintain new classroom spaces
- 2. the addition of one (1.0) FTE teaching position (from Core funding) to support the Ministry mandate to indigenize the redesigned curriculum
- 3. the addition of \$5,000 to the 2017/2018 budget for Teacher Inquiry Projects and up to \$10,000 for LSA Support in the fall of 2017 once financial reports for individual LSA's are collected and reviewed

Information Items:

Superintendent's Emergent Issues:

- The Superintendent of Schools/CEO advised that the Operations staff have been involved in a great deal of preparatory work to protect our facilities from potential flooding. In particular, the Superintendent/CEO thanked the Operations staff and the students of George Elliot Secondary School (GESS) for preparing George Elliot Secondary School for the potential of flooding.
- Schools in the Central Okanagan will not follow suit after a Victoria school banned cell phones. The Central Okanagan Public Schools Policy 486 – Student Use of Electronic and Social Media Communications clearly outlines the District's expectations for digital citizenship.
