1. Imbedding Kindness in Practice

Circle of Friends – A Multi-Grade Structure (K-6)

Principal Stathers spoke of a multi-age structure that involves building a sense of community through the 'circle of friends' program. School-wide friend groupings include approximately 15 K-6 students working on 'acts of kindness'. Both student presenters talked about the program enabling them to connect with students from other classes and to build a sense of community throughout the entire school. The intermediate students also spoke of how much they enjoy the opportunities to be role models and leaders of this program. Teachers, Mr. Manders and Ms. Baxter, spoke of how applied designed skills and technology and the core/curriculum competencies are embedded, in an authentic way, in the learning to build confident, positive learners.

Principal Steen and Vice-Principal Kuhn spoke of MBSS students' Acts of Kindness, including door greeters opening doors for students during Mental Health Week, acts of kindness from school teams, etc. MBSS staff have been focusing on an inquiry process for the past two years to deepen school spirit and a positive school culture. This year, MBSS is focusing on the theme, "Make Your Mark", encouraging students to leave a positive print on society. MBSS is also piloting a program called, 'Character Strong' to build strong, contributing character in our students.

1. School Opening Report Part 1

Kevin Kaardal, Superintendent of Schools/CEO for the Central Okanagan Public Schools, presented the School Opening Report Part 1. This Report covers the time period of September 5 through 8, 2017 and provides an update regarding the first four days of the school year. Admin Council and schools in the District reported a smooth and orderly opening this year. To date, the majority of schools appear to be at projection. Once all of the adjustments are made, it is anticipated that the District will experience an overall increase in enrolment over last year. Detailed enrolment numbers, organized by schools and zones, will be provided in Part 2 of the School Opening Report at the September 27th Public Board Meeting, as well as following the September 30th 1701 submission to the Ministry of Education.
