#### Presentation:

### 1. University of British Columbia Okanagan Update and Information Regarding UBC's Aspire Community Consultation Process for Creating a Shared Vision for the Future of the Okanagan Campus

Presenter: Bud Mortenson, Director, University Relations

Approximately 300 Central Okanagan School District graduates attend the University of British Columbia Okanagan each year. Mr. Mortenson described UBC's Aspire Community Consultation Process where partners in the community, business and government, and students, faculty, and staff are being asked to engage in the consultative process to envision the future of UBC Okanagan. The vision developed will guide the future planning, growth and development of the university. The public is welcome to provide feedback through aspire.ok.ubc.ca.

### 2. Canadian Student Leadership Conference (CSLC) 2014 – Update

In 200 days, the Central Okanagan School District will be hosting the 30th Annual Canadian Student Leadership Conference. The District's CSLC Planning Committee is 78 strong and all are working hard to organize an exceptional conference for the 1000 student delegates who will be attending from all across the country. Keynote speakers include: The Happiness is Now Team, Micah Jacobson, Trey Anthony, Ta'Kaiya Blaney and others to be confirmed. These inspirational speakers will focus on empowering students to make a difference locally and globally.

Mr. Coble also announced that the Aboriginal Education Council supports the District's Aboriginal Program Preliminary Budget for the 2014-2015 school year; however, the Council recommends that the Board of Education consider cost-sharing, from general funds, the Aboriginal Education Resource Teacher.

#### Declaration:

### 1. Province of British Columbia Proclamation – Bullying Awareness Day, February 26, 2014

The Central Okanagan Board of Education affirmed February 26, 2014 as "Bullying Awareness Day" in School District No. 23 (Central Okanagan).

### 2. Education Week 2014

The Central Okanagan Board of Education declared March 10 – 14, 2014 as "Education Week" in School District No. 23 (Central Okanagan).

#### Action Items:

### 1. Fascieux Creek Redevelopment – École KLO Middle School

The Board of Education approved, in principle, the Fascieux Creek Conceptual Restoration Pre-Design and directed staff to work with the City of Kelowna to develop a Statutory Right-of-Way for maintenance purposes of Fascieux Creek for subsequent approval by the Board. The Board of Education further approved the Secretary-Treasurer to use his professional discretion to sign off as the owner on appropriate grant submissions by the KLO Green Parent Committee and that a \$68,500 budget request be referred to the Finance and Legal Committee to be included in budget discussions.

### 2. Proposal for Substantive Change (George Elliot Secondary School Golf Academy)

The Board of Education approved the Proposal for Substantive Change (George Elliot Secondary School Golf Academy).

### 3. Proposal for Substantive Change (Mount Boucherie Secondary School Baseball Academy)

The Board of Education approved the Proposal for Substantive Change (Mount Boucherie Secondary School Baseball Academy).

#### 4. 2014-2015 School Calendar

The Board of Education adopted a Local School Calendar for the 2014-2015 school year as identified below and will make the calendar available to all parents by February 28, 2014, and the Ministry of Education by March 31, 2014. Upon accepting the Local School Calendar for the 2014-2015 school year, the Board of Education agreed to continue to offer CUPE employees meaningful work as it was offered in the past, and, in addition, offer CEAs the opportunity to attend professional development for compensation. The Board of Education also requested that the Superintendent direct school Principals, in consultation with staff and parents, to establish a site-based calendar for the 2014-2015 school year. In establishing such calendars, principals must:

- a. Conform to the School Act and Regulations, applicable Collective Agreements, and School District No. 23 (Central Okanagan) Board Policy.
- b. Schedule school parent/teacher conference times.
- c. Schedule their school's calendar and bell schedule.
