 Jennifer Hopkinson – Request to Continue to Include Pretty Road in the Catchment Area for Davidson Road Elementary School

Ms. Hopkinson presented, on behalf of thirteen residents of Pretty Road, their support for retaining the Pretty Road area within the Davidson Road catchment. When the Board considers changes to the catchment areas in Lake Country, Ms. Hopkinson's letter will be included in all the responses received on this topic.

 The Board of Education approved the Joint Use Agreement (Mar Jok Elementary School) with the District of West Kelowna.

The Board of Education gave first, second and third readings, passed and adopted, School District No. 23 Capital Project Bylaw No. 126808 – Approved Bus Project, in the amount of \$788,296.75.

The Board of Education gave first, second, third readings, and adopted, School District No. 23 (Central Okanagan) Property Bylaw No. 131 (registration of a Statutory Right of Way) in favour of BC Hydro and TELUS on Parcel "C" (being a consolidation of Lots 22 to 32, see DD LB57950) Block G Section 17 Township 20 Osoyoos Division Yale District Plan 454.

Information Items:

1. Superintendent's Emergent Issues

- Based on today's inclement weather, there were power outages in several regions of the Central Okanagan School District. By the time the school day started, power was up in all but five schools. Oyama Traditional School's power was reinstated by mid-morning; however, Peachland Elementary School was without power for the entire day. Peachland's power outage resulted in a one-day school closure at Peachland Elementary. Power was out for short periods of time in the Rutland area; however, students were able to remain in session. It is very rare that a school closure has been called as a result of a poor weather conditions. The Superintendent acknowledged the staff in the District's Operations Department, including custodians shovelling heavy snow and bus drivers navigating students safely through challenging roads. Principals, Vice-Principals, teaching and support staff were also recognized for dealing with snow-related emergent items that arose throughout the day.
- The Superintendent announced that enrolment as of November 14, 2014 have been recorded as 21,852 (headcount) with full time equivalent students (FTE) registered at 21, 418.25.
- The District class size averages have now been calculated:
 - Kindergarten 20.2
 - Grades 1-3 22.6
 - Grades 4-7 25.3
 - Grades 8-12 22.9
- Given the work that is currently underway to improve all aspects of BC's K-12 Accountability Framework, the requirements of the 2014/2015 Superintendent's Report on Achievement will be the same as last year. Some student achievements results from last year are not available as a result of the recent labour dispute. Therefore, some of the student performance data from the 2013/2014 Superintendent's Report on Achievement will be 'rolled over' to this year's report.
- As a result of the public consultation meetings held in Lake Country (regarding revising catchment areas) and Rutland (regarding timing for new grade configurations), parental and community feedback is currently being collected through the ThoughtStream Exchange process. Hundreds of Lake Country parents/community members have provided their feedback on-line and over 5000 direct emails have been sent to parents in the Rutland area. This high level of engagement of the community is providing rich feedback for staff as they prepare recommendations for the Board of Education.
