Superintendent's Report:

The Superintendent reported on the following:

- School District No. 23 is in the process of updating the District's Long-Term Facility Plan and is hosting 5 community meetings to provide an opportunity for public input. One public consultation meeting was conducted for the Lake Country Zone at George Elliot Secondary School on Tuesday, May 8. The remaining public consultation meetings are scheduled as follows:
 - May 10, 6:30 pm Okanagan Mission Zone at Okanagan Mission Secondary Gym
 - May 14, 6:30 pm Rutland Zone at Rutland Senior Secondary Gym
 - o May 15, 6:30 pm Central Zone at Kelowna Secondary Multipurpose Room
 - May 22, 6:30 pm Westside Zone at Mount Boucherie Secondary Multipurpose Room
- Bill 36 The School Amendment Act This new enabling legislation from the Ministry of Education provides, amongst other things, maximum flexibility to Districts to establish their own school calendars in the years to come. As of the 2013/14 school year there will no longer be a 'standard school calendar' published by the Ministry.
- Impact of Withdrawl of Extra-Curricular Activities Schools are reporting that the majority of teachers are withdrawing from activities that normally take place outside of instructional time. This is including a variety of meetings, tutorial sessions, clubs and sports activities. The grade 12 graduation ceremonies along with the dinner/dance (prom) events are still proceeding, however, it is anticipated that there will be far less teacher involvement than in previous years.
- On June 9, 2012 School District No. 23 will be hosting the 2012 Retirement Dinner at the Coast Capri Hotel. There currently are 54 employees who have indicated their intent to retire.

Action Items:

1. Amended Policy 625 "Sites, Facility and Equipment Enhancements"

The Board of Education approved the amendments to Policy 625 "Sites, Facility and Equipment Enhancements".

2. Capital Projects Bylaw No. 115433 – Approved Bus Projects

The Board of Education gave first, second and third readings, passed and adopted School District No. 23 Capital Project Bylaw No. 115433 – Approved Bus Projects, in the amount of \$228,261.58.

3. BCSTA Conference – November 14-16, 2012 – Rescheduling of the November 14, 2012 Board Meetings

The Board of Education approved the rescheduling of the November 14, 2012 Public and Incamera Board Meetings to Tuesday, November 13, 2012, to accommodate trustee involvement in the provincial education conference happening at the same time.
