1. Springvalley Middle School – Orange Shirt Project

Mr. Baruta shared how Springvalley Middle School is incorporating the First Peoples' Principles of Learning within the redesigned curriculum, enriching the school culture and everyone's understanding of Aboriginal worldviews and perspectives. Mr. Gruenenwald described Springvalley Middle School's staff involvement in the Blanket Exercise, reflecting the past history of Canada. Aboriginal Student Advocates, Stephanie Kenequonash and Kathy Thibeault, spoke of the weeklong learning to deepen the students' understanding and commitment to Orange Shirt Day, recognizing the past history of residential schools.

Springvalley Elementary School – Kindness Counts at SVE

Mrs. Stevenson spoke of Springvalley Elementary School's school-wide focus on kindness, inspired by the Superintendent of Schools/CEO Kevin Kaardal's challenge to 'spread kindness' throughout our schools. Mr. Johnson described how the entire school is engaged in learning about kindness. Teachers, Kristi Fortuin and Drew Hamilton, spoke of creating language to 'name kindness' as well as implementing compliment circles to share 'acts of kindness'. Examples of kindness are posted in the classrooms and hallways, serving as an infectious motivator for students to demonstrate even more kindness.
